The Brigham Young University Department of Dance Ballet Area Dress Code for on- and off-campus coursework and activities

The Ballet Area Dress Code Expectations are as follows:

Men and Women:

- o Are permitted to wear layers for warmth in rehearsal when not dancing, or as approved for in-class use due to injury
- o Ballet technique shoes should be all one piece (no half-soled shoes)
- O All dancewear should be appropriate for the balletic discipline, clean & mended (no holes in tights or leotard seams)
- O Attire helps the dancer feel, look, and move like a professional
- o Designated changing areas should be used consistently
- o Anything not deemed conservative by your instructor will not be permitted

• Men:

- Black full-length tights worn into the shoes are required
- o Tights should be thick and remain opaque no matter how you move
- Dance belts must be worn under tights
- o Solid colored black or white shirt and/or leotard that is form-fitting and tucked into the tights, or are short enough to see pelvic alignment
- o Shirts should not be baggy or loose no matter how you move, have no logos, and should not expose a bare midriff.
- o White socks over full-length tights and under shoes are permitted if desired
- o Shoes should be black with no socks, or white with white socks
- o If hair is long enough to affect performance or is distracting, it should be pulled back with a headband or slicked back

• Women:

- o Women's leotards may be in any shade of black or blue
- o Conservative leg line
- o No sheer fabric in the midsection
- o No nude-colored fabric instead of straps or sleeves
- o Modest neckline (no halters) and full coverage at the bust
- o Backs must not be lower than navel height
- o No "cut-outs" in the bodice of any leotard including backs cut out to reach beyond the midline of the torso
- o Tights should be worn under leotards, and down into the shoes
- o Flesh-colored tights and shoes may be worn as long as they are identical in shade. Otherwise, traditional pink tights and shoes are required.
- o Hair worn in a tight ballet bun, or as close to this industry-standard as possible
- o No dangly earrings or any jewelry that might cause injury while partnering
- o Any sports bras should be completely hidden or match the line and color of the leotard if seen.
